

Your baby has been prescribed SYNAGIS

To help prevent severe RSV disease

SYNAGIS IS AN INJECTION OF VIRUS-FIGHTING ANTIBODIES GIVEN MONTHLY THROUGHOUT THE RSV SEASON*

Respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) is a seasonal virus, like the flu, that is easily spread



Most children get RSV by age 2; however, you should know that for babies with certain health conditions, RSV can be very serious



*RSV season typically lasts 5 months in the United States; however, it can vary by year and geographic region. High-risk infants should receive monthly doses (every 28-30 days) throughout RSV season.

It's important that your baby get the medicine he or she needs

Here's what is happening next and what you need to do:

- The doctor's office is working to get your baby's SYNAGIS prescription approved
Helpful Hint: Make sure your baby's doctor has the correct insurance information
- Once coverage is confirmed, your baby's prescription will be transferred to a Specialty Pharmacy†

ACTION STEP



YOUR APPROVAL IS NEEDED for SYNAGIS to be shipped to your baby's doctor. You will receive a call from the Specialty Pharmacy to confirm shipment and any required payment. **YOU MUST ANSWER THIS CALL**

Helpful Hint: This call will most likely come from a 1-800-number. If you miss this call, listen to the voicemail and call back the phone number provided

- Once the Specialty Pharmacy has received your approval and any required payment, the SYNAGIS dose will be shipped to your baby's doctor's office (or other designated location)

ACTION STEP



It is important that you **SCHEDULE DOSING APPOINTMENTS** with your baby's doctor (every 28-30 days)

Helpful Hint: Try to schedule all 5 SYNAGIS appointments in advance

†The Specialty Pharmacy is chosen by your insurance plan or selected by your baby's healthcare provider. A Specialty Pharmacy provides medications used to treat rare or complex conditions. Many times, these medications require a physician to administer the medication, have special delivery/shipment requirements, and require specific instructions from a pharmacist.

IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

Who should not receive SYNAGIS?

Children should not receive SYNAGIS if they have ever had a severe allergic reaction to it. Signs and symptoms of a severe allergic reaction could include severe rash, hives, or itchy skin; swelling of the lips, tongue, or face; swelling of the throat, difficulty swallowing; difficult, rapid, or irregular breathing; bluish color of skin, lips, or under fingernails; muscle weakness or floppiness; unresponsiveness.

If your child has any of these signs or symptoms of a severe allergic reaction after getting SYNAGIS, call your child's healthcare provider or get medical help right away.

*Eligibility requirements apply: Patient must be a resident of the US or Puerto Rico. Patient must be commercially insured. There are no income requirements to participate in the program. Patient must not be insured by any government, state, or federally funded prescription program, including Medicare, Medicaid, Medigap, VA, DOD, or TRICARE.

IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION (continued)

Before your child receives SYNAGIS, tell your child's healthcare provider about all of your child's medical conditions, including if your child:

- has ever had a reaction to SYNAGIS
- has bleeding or bruising problems

SYNAGIS is given by injection. If your child has a problem with bleeding or bruises easily, an injection could cause a problem.

Tell your child's healthcare provider about all the medicines your child takes, including prescription and over-the-counter medicines, vitamins, and herbal supplements.

What are the possible side effects of SYNAGIS?

Serious side effects include severe allergic reactions, which may happen after **any injection** of SYNAGIS and may be life-threatening or cause death. Call your child's healthcare provider or get medical help right away if your child has any of the signs or symptoms of a serious allergic reaction. The most common side effects of SYNAGIS include fever and rash.

INDICATION

SYNAGIS, 50 mg and 100 mg for injection, is a prescription medication that is used to help prevent a serious lung disease caused by respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) in children:

- born prematurely (at or before 35 weeks) **and** who are 6 months of age or less at the beginning of RSV season
- who have a chronic lung condition, called bronchopulmonary dysplasia (BPD), that needed medical treatment within the last 6 months, **and** who are 24 months of age or less at the beginning of RSV season
- born with certain types of heart disease **and** who are 24 months of age or less at the beginning of RSV season

SYNAGIS contains man-made, disease-fighting proteins called antibodies. It is not known if SYNAGIS is safe and effective to *treat* the symptoms of RSV in a child who already has RSV. SYNAGIS is used to help *prevent* RSV disease. It is not known if SYNAGIS is safe and effective in children who are older than 24 months of age at the start of dosing.

These are not all the possible side effects for SYNAGIS. For more information ask your child's healthcare provider.
